

Frequently Asked Questions

Will students need to have a Work Permit in order to participate? **No.** Work permits are not required for the 2021 Summer Workforce Development Academy.

Is the program free? Yes.

What days and times will I start work? Students are required to attend Monday through Thursday from 8:30am – 2:30pm. Students must work the entire day to qualify for stipends.

How will I know if my application is approved? All students must submit an online application and will be notified prior to May 31st that their application has been approved as well as the track to which the student has been assigned.

Are meals provided for students? All students will be provided breakfast and lunch through the Columbus Recreation and Parks summer lunch program. Students are allowed to pack lunches, however ordering outside food during program hours is prohibited.

Where will I be working? All students will work at 4117 E. Livingston Avenue.

Is transportation to work provided by All THAT? Transportation to and from All THAT **may be** provided by All THAT if the student resides within our pick-up area. Our typical service area is between James Rd and Broad St, Hamilton Rd and Broad Street, Chatterton and Old Brice Rd and James and Winchester Pike. Bus routes/pick-up locations will be determined prior to the start of the program based on student enrollment.

How old do students have to be to participate? Only students 14 – 18 years old may apply for summer workforce development opportunities. Students must be 14 years old by June 7, 2021.

Orientation: A parent or guardian **and** participating students **must** attend an online ZOOM orientation. Sessions will be held on May 25th or 27th at either 11:00am or 5:30pm. An 11:00am session will be held on May 26th. Parents and students may attend separately, and parents may also make separate arrangements to meet with All THAT staff prior to May 27th to meet orientation requirements.

Are students paid for participation in this program? Students are provided a \$10 stipend for active participation in the program. Stipends are based on active participation, attitude and completion of required assignments. Stipends are payable only for completion of full days of work.

Will students be paid cash stipends? No. Stipends are paid via direct deposit on a weekly basis for work performed the prior week. Parents are responsible for establishing direct deposit accounts prior to June 1, 2021.

How do students qualify for Driver's Education? Students must be 16 years old by June 7, 2021 and have proof of a valid temporary license before actual classes start. All THAT will reimburse the permit fee with a valid receipt.
